Re: Title 40 CFR Part 441 Dental Office Category: Amalgam Rule

As part of our mission to return clean water to our environment, the City of Palm Bay Utilities Department is responsible for monitoring and controlling non-domestic wastewater discharges into our sanitary sewer system.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) established Effluent Limitation Guidelines and Standards for the Dental Category (Title 40 CFR Part 441) that became effective on July 14, 2017. The rule applies to wastewater discharges from facilities where the practice of dentistry is performed, including, but not limited to, institutions, permanent or temporary offices, clinics, home offices, and facilities owned and operated by Federal, state or local governments, that discharges wastewater to a Publicly Owned Treatment Works (POTW). In accordance with the Dental Amalgam Rule, the EPA requires these dental facilities to submit to the POTW, in this case the Palm Bay Utilities Department, a onetime compliance report.

To assist in your compliance with this federal requirement, the Palm Bay Utilities Department has developed the enclosed Dental Amalgam Survey that will serve as your one-time compliance report. Please complete the Dental Amalgam Survey and return the original, signed document by <u>October 9, 2020</u>. A one-time permit inspection fee of \$95.33 will be charged, in accordance with Chapter 201.281 of the Sewer Use Code, at time of inspection.
